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## MUSIC TRIAL LESSON WEEK!

If your child is in Year 6, 7 or 8 and involved in Outdoor Week they can still have the opportunity to sign up for a trial lesson, but this will take place during the final week of term.






#### CRICKET

The U13B cricket team continued their strong season with another comprehensive victory over Prior Park. The opening pairing of **Lukas** and **Jake** again did well, scoring 42 before the first wicket went down, which set an excellent platform for others to help get the team to 126-5 from 20 overs. Some excellent calling and running between the wickets helped run the total up as high as possible.

As you can see from the wagon wheel, runs came from all around the ground, but it was nice to see the work in training on leg-side shots really paying dividends. At the halfway point we spoke about making a strong start with sharp fielding and tight bowling, hoping to restrict Prior Park in their first five overs. **Oscar** was clearly listening as he took four wickets in the opening over, including a very sharp caught-and-bowled chance. From this point on, Millfield took wickets at regular intervals to take all 10 wickets before the halfway point with Prior Park, making 61 for their total.





#### TENNIS

Good luck to **Joshua** and **Charlie** who are competing in the Road to Wimbledon Regional event for players rated 6.2 or higher at the East Gloc Tennis Club this weekend.

Also, congratulations to **Toby** who has been accepted into the LTA Grade 2 National U10 Tournament in Glasgow on 25 and 26 June.

Ten of our U10 players competed against All Hallows on Tuesday in singles and doubles matches at home. Everyone played really well in the sunshine and we won the match overall.

On Wednesday 24 of our Year 7&8 girls competed against Wells Cathedral school and everyone had a lovely afternoon of doubles play on the Astro court. Very well done to all our Tennis players who competed over half term. **Toby, John, Fredi** and **Chloe and Luke** all played in the Grade 5 Martock Tennis Tournament, with Toby beating John in the U10 singles final. Toby was also runner-up in both the Swindon and the Sherborne Grade 4 U10 singles events, and played in the Grade 3 match in Bristol.

**Charlie** and **Josh** both competed in the Tennis Europe event in Wrexham and Josh got through qualifying and won his first round match. Josh also won the U14 singles at the Grade 3 in Bristol. Charlie reached the Semi Final of Woking Grade 3 U14 singles and won U14 Dubs. He also won U16 Grade 4 at Sherborne and was Runner up in U18 Grade 4 in Cardiff.

**Louise** came third in the U18 Grade 5 in Oxford.

#### SAILING

Before half term the U13s followed the success of the Year 6s for the MPS Regatta at Portland Harbour. There were 21 boats from seven schools making the most of the difficult, light wind racing conditions. They battled all morning and learnt a lot by being part of a quality fleet.

This was the first time racing for some of our sailors and they did very well to stay competitive in the challenging racing conditions. **Maia** and **Hunter** were in our top boat, coming in 6th. New pairing, **George** and **Frederick** had some fantastic starts, along with some consistent perseverance from **Ollie** and **Sam**. All the sailors behaved impeccably and were a credit to the school.





Maia and Vanja competed in the British National Sailing Championships from 29 May to 1st June. They had four race days with 12 races completed in the series.

Mala and Vanja placed 2nd overall in Juniors in the Gold fleet, so a great result. They will now go on to compete in the 2021 RS Feva World Championships in Travemünde, Germany on 23 July.
