School Policy on Careers Guidance

Millfield provides a comprehensive programme of careers and higher education advice and guidance, starting at Millfield Prep School and continuing through Year 9 to the Upper Sixth form in the Senior School. This handbook gives an overview of the main elements of this programme in the Senior School.

Whilst we have a range of experience and knowledge in house, we also make use of external and impartial professional agencies, such as FutureSmart Careers, Morrisby, MyFutureChoice and Unifrog, as well as a mix of outside speakers and Old Millfieldians.

Students receive guidance through a variety of methods, including 1:1 meetings with careers staff, presentations from universities, employers and alumni, careers fairs, the UCAS Exhibition, PSHEE sessions, assemblies, via careers profiling and guidance interviews as well as in their regular discussions with group tutors, house masters and mistresses.

An important focus of the Careers department is to help students make subject choices for GCSE, A level and higher education that allow them to follow their interests and keep their options open for future careers. We facilitate this by helping students become aware of their abilities and interests so that they can make informed choices about their futures.
