It is great to be able to go to these events again and have our athletes show their talents on the track and in the field. Our athletes are already looking forward to next year!



Autumn term 2021 we had record numbers of Millfield athletes compete at the South West Biathlon, more than 50 athletes qualified for the British Modern Biathlon Championships and a record number of medals! Over the 2022 summer term Millfield attended the European & World Championship qualifiers in Biathle & Triathle, Millfield athletes qualified to represent Great Britain at both events! Followed on by the South West Discover Laser run qualifier and the National Schools' Biathle, both competitions are great grassroot/school events enabling pupils to give multi-sport competitions a go, gaining experience and enjoyment.

During the summer term 2022, some Millfield athletes were invited to attend the UIPM international Biathle meet in Madeira, this competition was a great experience and achievement for our young athletes. But also a preparation event for Europeans & Worlds later in 2022. It has been an eventful but successful year and I look forward to another very exciting year ahead for our athletes.

During the summer term, the same competition started again for our current Year 7 and 8's and both our boys and girls teams have won all their matches and have qualified for the county playoffs in September. Year 7 and 8 boys won both the county and regional rounds and are therefore playing at the Nationals in Bolton in December.

Our U12 Boys Team qualified for the Premier Division of the LTA National Club League and came up against strong opposition from Swansea Tennis Club and David Lloyd, Bristol, but managed a convincing win against Prestige Tennis Club in Gloucester. Some of our Prep players also represented Millfield Senior School in the U14 Premier Division of the same competition.

Trampolining

The National Schools took place in March in Macclesfield. The girls finished a very credible 4th place. The boys team consisted of **Brychan**, **Noah**, and **Harry** filling in for **Barnaby** who was

absent. They placed 3rd team, **Brychan** was a very credible 7th place from the 14 boys who qualified nationwide.

Our last competition of the season was the IAPS National Finals held at Croydon, in May. 18 pupils from MPS competed. At this event the nominated A teams compete against each other.
