



Sixth Form Clothing Guide

In the Millfield Sixth Form, all students are expected to dress smartly in business attire for lessons and to follow this guidance throughout the school day.

Sixth Form uniform does not need to be purchased in the school shop, except for school ties and sports clothing.

Suit jackets are optional for everyday clothes, but are obligatory for formal dress.

Suit

All students should wear a matching dark suit / jacket, worn with trousers, a skirt or a dress. This should be black, dark grey or dark blue; faint pin stripe or very subtle check is permitted. The suit jacket need not be worn at all times around campus during the school day but is required for formal occasions.

Trousers must be full length and be made of a material that can hold a crease.

Skirts and dresses should be tailored below, on or just above the knee.

Trouser and skirt suits must be worn with either:

- a formal full-length sleeved shirt, with conventional collar, cuffs and fabric, in a plain style or with a subtle pattern, worn with a school tie purchased from the school shop; or
- a formal full-sleeved blouse, with conventional collar and fabric, in a plain style or with a subtle pattern, worn without a tie.

Dresses do not need to be worn with a shirt or blouse, provided that the shoulders are covered.

Shirts and blouses should be tucked in at all times. All students should wear a plain white shirt or blouse with their suit for formal occasions, such as Headmaster's Assemblies, Wells Cathedral services and away matches.

Suits should be worn with plain, smart, flat, dark shoes that can take a polish

Socks should be worn with a trouser suit. Dark or flesh-coloured tights may be worn with a skirt or dress.

Optional Extras

- a waistcoat in a fabric that complements the suit
- a plain, tight-knit, V-necked, round-necked or quarter-zip jumper, suitable for wearing under a suit jacket
 - Note - the bottom of the jumper must not hang below the suit jacket
- a smart, plain, dark overcoat
 - Note - the hemline of the coat must hang below the suit jacket
- Outdoor coats should be removed for lessons and assemblies.



Items Not Permitted

- suits made from leather, shiny, skin-tight or stretchy fabrics
- shoes made from suede or canvas
- boots; sandals; and trainer-style shoes e.g. Nike Air force
- patterned tights
- sweatshirts
- gilets

Summer Term Options

Students may opt to wear a suit in a lighter-coloured fabric. The jacket and trousers/skirt/dress must still match. The date for summer dress will be communicated with students in the summer term, weather dependent.

Personal Appearance

Minimal make up is permitted.

Clean shaven appearance at all times.

Hair must be smart and not impair vision, if dyed should be a natural hair colour only.

Any jewellery should be simple and discreet, no highly conspicuous earrings e.g. large hoops, no visible ankle bracelets, and no face piercings or visible body piercings or tattoos allowed.

Day to day school wear need not include a suit jacket but students must own the matching suit jacket as it will be required for formal occasions.

All students are expected to dress smartly and to follow this guidance throughout the school day.

Sports Clothing

All students require core items of the Millfield-branded sports clothing (tracksuit, shorts and top) which should be purchased from the school shop.

Non-Millfield sports kit may not be worn around campus during the school day. This includes house hoodies, club tops and Kukri kit.

Shorts may not be worn in the dining hall at lunch.
